2025 ELCA CHURCHWIDE ASSEMBLY The 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly was held July 28 - August 2 at the Phoenix Convention Center in Phoenix, Arizona. The approximate 845 voting members, elected by the ELCA's 65 synods, made major decisions on social statements, proposals, and resolutions over the course of eleven plenary sessions. Meaningful and inspiring worship opportunities were offered on a daily basis. The assembly elected the Rev. Yehiel Curry as the new ELCA Presiding Bishop and the Rev. Lucille "CeCee" Mills as the new ELCA Secretary for six-year terms (pictured below.) The assembly showed their appreciation to retiring ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton and ELCA Secretary Sue Rothmeyer. Twenty-two elected voting members attended from the Northeastern PA Synod including these individuals from the Schuylkill Mission District: Nancy Reichelt (NEPA Synod VP), Dr. Donald Boyer (NEPA Synod Treasurer), Pastor Ken Melber, Jr. (NEPA Synod Secretary), Amanda Melber, Pastor Brian Beissel, and Stephen Hikes. Barbara Hikes attended as a non-voting guest.
