Food Pantry

Our pantry distributed three bags of groceries, two bags of perishable foods, and our homemade soups (made by our youth group) on Wednesday, September 24th, Thursday, September 25th, Sunday, September 28th, and days after to 30+ households. Our volunteers delivered to ten of those households.

We thank you for your generosity of time and resources. Our Harvest Home monetary gifts and gifts of food helped bolster the amount of food we could deliver to people in need. Monetary gifts included \$1,500 from our church's offerings designated for the food pantry as well as a \$250 Thrivent grants. Thirteen volunteers helped, amounting to 43 hours of time. Our next distribution will be happening on Thanksgiving weekend. Please keep this outreach ministry in your prayers.



Youth Ministry Events

On Sunday, September 21st, four adults and five youth worked all afternoon making 90 quarts total of chicken potpie and vegetable soup which, in the following weeks, were taken to several members (seniors and some with health issues) as well as distributed at the food pantry on September 24th, September 25th, September 28th, and weeks following.





On Sunday, October 5th, after the Sunday School hour, our youth group met for a wonderful lunch prayed over by our youngest attendee, a 7-year-old. After seven adults and four youth partook of macaroni and cheese, Sloppy Joe sandwiches, pretzels, pumpkin rolls, and gummy candies, we ventured onto a Swatara Creek trail above Lickdale. We began the walk in prayer, thanking God for the beautiful creation we were about to experience.

On that warm, early fall adventure of a 2.2 mile walk of conversation, exercise, and enjoying each other's company, we were greatly appreciative of our time spent together. Three adults and four youth completed the walk, ranging in age from seven to 78. We hope that you might join us for our next walk.
