**From the Pastor:**

In 1514, Albrecht of Hollenzollern made a corrupt deal with Pope Leo X to purchase the position of Archbishop of Mainz in violation of canon law. The greedy Pope authorized the sale of Indulgences to finance the purchase, with half the revenue going directly to Rome.

In 1517, John Tetzel, Germany's foremost hawker of Indulgences, came to Wittenberg, where Martin Luther was a pastor and professor of theology. As a sales technique, Tetzel made exaggerated claims for the power of Indulgences, convincing many people that purchasing them actually would forgive their sins.

Martin Luther was appalled by Tetzel's false claims and as a professor and pastor felt it was his duty to protest the sale of Indulgences. Luther produced his 95 Theses concerning Indulgences, which criticized the claims and practices of the Indulgence hawkers. On All Saints' Day (November 1<sup>st</sup>) it was customary for students and faculty members of Luther's University to debate Theses (short, pointed statements intended to be controversial and spark enthusiastic exchanges). Luther offered his 95 Theses on Indulgences for the debate, and, according to tradition, nailed them to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg on October 31, 1517.

Before 1517, Luther had written some criticisms of the Roman Catholic theology and Church practices of his day, but his early efforts were ignored. But his 95 Theses were widely circulated in Germany and sparked a storm of protest against the Pope and the Roman Church. Luther suddenly became an international figure, and the Protestant Reformation was born.

Church historians consider October 31, 1517 as the beginning of the Reformation, and we have now reached the point of celebrating its 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary on this coming October 31<sup>st</sup>!

## Highlights from the September 7<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting

The Property Committee reported that it has received a bid from Kriner Electric of Orwigsburg for the video hook-up project. A few questions were raised that need to be investigated before acting on the bid. The Church furnace has a new expansion tank, and a new dishwasher has been installed in the Church kitchen and new AC units in the Church office. The parsonage furnace has been replaced. The sidewalk leading to the Church office will be replaced using volunteer labor, for a cost of about \$1,100. Pressure reducing valves will be installed in the Church and the parsonage.

The Worship Committee has dry cleaned the choir robes. The Council approved the committee's recommendation to have special worship service using polka music on October 8<sup>th</sup>. New green paraments will be dedicated on September 24<sup>th</sup>.

The Evangelism Committee continues to work on coordinating lists of names for Committee outreach.

The Finance Committee will meet in September to begin budget planning and to think about ways to enable electronic giving.

Discussion was held concerning the Youth Ministry Committee, which is presently inactive. Financial Secretary Ben Moyer presented a request to open a separate designated account for Youth Ministry. Preliminary approval was given pending the reactivation of the Youth Ministry Committee and appointment of Committee officers.

The Endowment Fund reported that two bank CD's were opened so that interest can be earned on some designated monies that are not immediately needed.

Under New Business:

Jeremy Zerbe was re-approved to do snow removal for the sidewalks and Bob Rhen was re-approved to plow the parking lot.

The Council voted to participate in a project initiated by St. Mark's (Brown's) Church to send a truck load of supplies to Texas to help hurricane victims.

The fund balances as of August 31<sup>st</sup> were:

General Fund -- \$ 1,954

General Savings -- \$ 140

Capital Improvement Fund -- \$ 20,305 (\$ 6,869 designated for the video and \$1,265 for the Fellowship Committee to use for kitchen improvements)

Memorial Fund -- \$ 9,410

Savings Certificate (Stew Zerbe Scholarship Fund) -- \$ 6,995

The Treasurer reported that all bills have been paid. People have been generous, and our Capital Improvement Fund is doing well.

### WEDNESDAY NIGHT LIVE

## CHRISTIAN EDUCATION SUNDAY

“Christian Education Sunday” was held on August 27<sup>th</sup> this year. Our Sunday School teachers were installed and we presented Bibles to our 5<sup>th</sup> Graders during the 9:00 AM worship service. Two of our 5<sup>th</sup> Graders, Abby Wolfe and Alexa Brown, served as lectors and read Scripture lessons from their new Bibles. We sang Sunday School songs that have been used here for decades, so they were familiar to both children and adults. The Senior Choir presented a special anthem.

During the Sunday School period, we had a special blessing of the children and their school backpacks and supplies, and our students were promoted to their new classes.

The Adult Class, led by Steve Hikes, began a study of Luther’s *Small Catechism* using the resource book *Free to Be* by Gerhard Forde and James Nestigen, retired Professors at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota. The Adult Class meets in the Sanctuary, near the piano, and new members are always welcome!

We have Sunday School classes for all ages from Nursery through Adult. Our teachers prepare Bible-based lessons, and there are crafts for the younger classes. Barb Hikes leads music for all of the classes, with a mixture of old classics and new tunes that the students really enjoy. Everyone is welcome for Sunday School, which runs from 10:30 to 11:30 AM every Sunday. See you there!
