Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

About five years ago when I was at Trinity in Valley View, I received a concerned call from a parishioner. "Pastor," he said, "are you okay?"

At the time, it was a Friday and Michelle and I had Timmy in the car. We like this unique supermarket called Trader Joe's. At that point, the closest one was in State College. So I was on I-80 on the way back with a car full of food.

Apparently, he had received a text claiming to be from me saying that I was in some sort of trouble and needed \$500 sent via Western Union. It was fairly stilted language, so he was skeptical that it was really me. He was right to be skeptical.

Since then, a time or two other people who have called me pastor have gotten text messages claiming to be from me asking for gift cards and all kinds of other things. I have colleagues who have had this happen as well- it's getting to be a popular scam.

So this is as good a time as any to say this- I will never, ever, EVER call you or text you to ask for gift cards. In general, I don't ask parishioners for money, and if I needed an emergency \$500, I probably would ask family members (and I have never been in a situation where I've needed something like that.)

People like to prey on others' trust in their pastors, unfortunately. And in our technological age, people use all kinds of technology to take advantage of others. In the meantime, we need to be vigilant.

The heartache in this is that we are a people who try to care about others (at least I hope we are.) When someone hurts someone in this way, we tend to want to shut off that part of ourselves in a move motivated by protection.

I just finished a Bible Study about the Dorcas story in Acts. Dorcas was a woman in the early church who knit all kinds of cloth and clothes for people in need. We are told that charity was in her heart, and when Peter goes to visit her community, people show him all that she had made to help others. She at that point was sick and died, and then God uses Peter to bring her back. The message, to me, is clear-God loves generosity and charity, and loves when his children act in certain ways.

So yes, be vigilant. But also be loving.


