Pastor's Letter

Grace and Peace from our risen Lord, Jesus Christ. Amen!

I remember very well the abandoned highway outside of Centralia. If you were ever there, you would see this giant bubble that formed about halfway through the road, and years ago that bubble opened up and formed a giant crack in the road, and steam from the mine fire would rise up from that crack.

I remember years ago taking a walk with a German pastor who had heard of Centralia but had never seen it. As we walked past the crack, it was clear that there was a group of teenage skateboarders there, using the ramp to jump.

Of course, the whole story of Centralia is a warning to all of us, in that if we aren't careful in our care of what God has given us, things can go awry quickly. If you aren't aware, there are a number of legends in how the mine fire started, but many people point to a story of a Christmas in the early 1960s where the borough collected everyone's trees, hauled them to the outskirts of town, and burned them. Unfortunately, an exposed part of the coal vein was near the burning pile of trees, and the fire continued to burn to this very day. You might have heard the story of the young child playing in their backyard, only to have the ground open up beneath them, going very deep into the ground.

If we don't take care of what God has given us, we pay for it later. That includes taking care of our neighbors, taking care of our land, and taking care of our church. That means checking in with each other, making sure needs are met, and making sure that we all play a part in making the church work. We are only as strong as our weakest link!

In our first food basket distribution since we set up shop in the parsonage, I saw this in action. I saw people putting orders together, people delivering food, people donating refrigerators and freezers, people bringing food to donate, people getting Thrivent grants to jumpstart this ministry into action, and so many more things. As a result, we served 90 people across 22 families, and we still have food that we can use to fill emergency orders.

We all play a part. And when we do this in the spirit of care for our neighbor, we help to ensure that "spiritual Centralias" don't happen.




